Cougars to the State Track Meet

Coach Mel Barnett is anxiously awaiting Central's performance at the state track meet at Wichita State University on May 25. He believes he has a number of athletes that could qualify at the regionals this Friday. The girls' team boasts two girls that could qualify. Junior Sarah Hagen is participating in the 400 meter dash and the triple jump. Sarah's best time this year in the 400 meter dash was 1:05.30 and her best jump was 32"7". Senior Micaela Ensz will be jumping in the long jump and throwing the javelin and the discus. Micaela's best jump this year was 15'3", her best throw in the javelin was 110'8", and her best throw in the discus was 101'10. Micaela broke the CCS school record in the javelin and the discus.

Freshman Matthew Nachtigal will be participating in the high jump at regionals. Matt's best jump of the year was 5'8". Junior Zac Krehbiel will be running the 100 meter dash and the 200 meter dash. Zac will also be in the long jump competition. Zac's best finish in the 100 meter dash was 11.1 and he ran a best 23.2 in the 200 meter dash earlier this year. Zac broke the CCS record in the 100 meter dash. The long jump competition saw Zac jump 19'7" as a season best. A newcomer to the sport, Senior Anthony Taylor ran a season best 54 seconds flat in the 400 meter before pulling a hamstring. His 54.0 was the second best time entering regional competition. Anthony's hamstring seems to be healed and he is looking forward to qualifying for state.

Dual Credit Courses at CCS

Administrator, Tim Kuhns, announced last week that CCS has reached an agreement with Central Christian College of Kansas to offer dual credit courses for juniors and seniors at CCS. The exact offerings are still undecided, but will be announced as soon as they are determined. We hope to be able to offer 2-3 dual credit courses this coming school year, says Kuhns. Potential offerings include calculus, government, chemistry, worldview, and others. The dual credit would allow a student to get both high school and college credit for the course and cost only \$65 per credit hour. The courses will be taught here on the CCS campus. Dr. Gretchen Esping, the dual credit representative from Central Christian College, will be giving a seminar next week to the members of the CCS faculty who are interested in teaching the courses.
